STANDARD RATING

As a result of an inspection made by State officials, Fayetteville State Teachers College was given an unconditional rating as a standard four-year teachers college, empowered to grant the Class A Certificate and the Bachelor of Science degree, by action of the State Board of Education, May 22, 1939.

NEW BUILDINGS

The gymnasium and third dormitory for young women were completed during the summer of 1938. By August, 1939, the Science Building and a second dormitory for young men will have been completed at a cost of \$156,800. In addition, a cottage for teachers has been built, Vance Hall, the present men's dormitory has been completely renovated, extensive repairs have been made to Bickett Hall and to H. L. Cook Dining Hall, and the older buildings have been painted both inside and outside. These improvements have been made possible by the generosity of the North Carolina Legislature, with substantial aid from the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works, and the Works Progress Administration. Furthermore, a landscaping and beautification project is now being operated by the National Youth Administration.

SUMMER SCHOOL

The first session of summer school begins Tuesday, June 6, 1939.

The second session of summer school begins Monday, July 17, 1939

Courses will be given in both sessions leading to the Class A teacher's certificate, to the Elementary Principal's certificate, and to the B. S. degree.
