Dr. James A. Anderson

Chancellor of the University

Chancellor James A. Anderson is committed to making FSU a university of choice through advanced technology, new cutting edge academic programs, expanded partnerships with the community and educational institutions, globalism, student success, and professional development for faculty, staff and students. The FSU Strategic Plan for 2009-2014 delineated six major priorities for achieving this goal: retention and graduation rates; economic transformation; intellectual and cultural center; leaders and global citizens; collaborations and partnerships; and fiscal resourcefulness and sustainability. As a result, FSU has gained unprecedented accolades for its academic programs, fiscal stability, community collaboration, student success, sustainability, energy efficiency, and innovations in the performing and fine arts. The implementation of the new Strategic Plan for 2015-2020, which included the Celebration of our Sesquicentennial (150th Anniversary) in 2017-2018, and the largest fund-raising campaign in the institution's history, which reached over \$27 million solidifies FSU status as a world-class institution of choice.

Dr. Anderson had proved to be a transformative educational leader before he began his tenure of office at FSU on June 9, 2008. He chaired the Department of Psychology at Xavier University in New Orleans from 1976-1983, and taught psychology at the Indiana University of Pennsylvania until 1992. Afterward, he served for eleven years (1992-2003) as Vice Provost for Undergraduate Affairs at North Carolina State University. At NCSU, he was credited with leading a revision of the general education curriculum, as well as the development of the First Year College, the Honors Programs, the Faculty Center for Teaching and Learning, the Minority Engineering Program, and the North Carolina State Diversity Initiative, among others. In 2003, Anderson became Vice President and Associate Provost for Institutional Assessment and Diversity at Texas A&M University. He held that post until joining the University at Albany in 2005 as Vice President for Student Success and Vice Provost for Institutional Assessment and Diversity.

Anderson is active in professional, civic and higher-education organizations, from which he has received prestigious awards. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools' Commission on Colleges, a member of the American Council on Education's Commission on Inclusion, the Board of Directors of United Way of Cumberland County, the Educators Serving Educators Advisory Board for Excelsior College in Albany, New York, and chair of the Board of Directors of the Sustainability Communities Foundation in Fayetteville.

Anderson's research and writing have focused on the assessment of student learning, as well as the impact of diversity on student learning, retention, and overall institutional effectiveness. He is the author or coauthor of numerous books, including "The Unfinished Agenda: Brown v. Board of Education" (2004) and "Driving Change through Diversity and Globalization—Transformative Leadership in the Academy Raised in Washington, D.C, Anderson received his bachelor's degree in psychology from Villanova University in Pennsylvania in 1970 and a doctorate in psychology in 1980 from Cornell University in New York.

Mitch Colvin is a native of Fayetteville with a passion for helping to improve the City. He was elected Mayor in November 2017. Prior to that, he served two consecutive terms on City Council as a Council Member for District 3 from 2013-15 and from 2015-17.

In 1995, at the age of 21, Mr. Colvin assumed the operational leadership of Colvin Funeral Home, Inc. He still leads the operation of Colvin Funeral Home, Inc. today, helping residents in their time of need. At the time he assumed control, the company was experiencing significant financial and regulatory distress. Mr. Colvin learned at an early age that being in business is not easy. Over the last 20 years, he has worked to build a strong, community-oriented business, restore goodwill and address remaining legacy issues. Today, his company is a market leader in funeral home service calls. Mr. Colvin believes that hard work and commitment in the face of adversity is crucial to survival in business and life.

Mayor Colvin's vision is to help Fayetteville prepare for the future by building a viable work force, investing in infrastructure and expanding our City's connection to the global economy. He is placing a strong emphasis on economic development; education and training; and the creation of a safe and secure community. In 2019, Mayor Colvin welcomed Segra to Fayetteville as they will expand their fiberoptics business in the city. The Mayor hopes that Segra will be able to improve fiberoptic connectivity for current businesses and that Segra can help attract new businesses to Fayetteville.

Fayetteville State University Historical Sketch

Fayetteville State University was founded in 1867. It began, under the direction of Mr. Robert Harris, as the Howard School with Harris serving as its first principal. Located on Gillespie Street in Fayetteville, the Howard School was erected on land purchased by seven Black men: David A. Bryant, Nelson Carter, Andrew J. Chesnutt, George Grange, Sr., Matthew Leary, Thomas Lomax, and Robert Simmons. In 1877, by legislative action providing for the establishment of a teacher training institution for Black North Carolinians, the Howard School became the first State Colored Normal School and the second-oldest public institution of higher education in the state. In 1907, the institution moved to its current location on Murchison Road. In 1939, the institution was renamed Fayetteville State Teachers College and became a four-year college that received state and regional accreditation in 1947. In 1959, the curriculum was expanded to offer degree programs outside the teaching field. In 1963, the name was changed to Fayetteville State College. In 1969, the name was changed to Fayetteville State University to reflect the institution's legislative designation as a regional institution, and in 1972, FSU became a constituent institution of The University of North Carolina. Today, FSU is a Comprehensive Level I institution offering degrees at the baccalaureate and master's levels, and the doctorate in educational leadership.

The University Seal

The seal for Fayetteville State University, commissioned in 1989, was recently redesigned but retained the previous historic symbols. The seal shows the historic Alumni Gates, erected in 1925. Below the gates, the founding year of 1867 is prominently displayed. Between the gates is the Howard School from which the university emerged. An open book depicts the early mission of the university as a teacher preparatory institution, and clasped hands inside the book symbolize unity. Within the banner is the university Motto, "Res Non Verba," Latin for "Deeds, Not Words."

The University Mace

The ceremonial mace dates back to ancient Rome, where it honored heroes and nobility. Today, it is used as a symbol of authority. The mace was first adopted at Fayetteville State University in 1986 and has recently been redesigned. During all formal academic processions the mace is carried by the Chief Marshal. Fayetteville State University's Chief Academic Marshal is its Teacher of the Year, who is named annually during Spring Commencement. The university mace is 48" in height with a fluted walnut staff. Adorning the head is the university seal in gold. It is embraced with laurels to mark the spirit of victory. When unattended, the mace stands in a solid walnut and gold base.

The Chamtenut's Intend

State University Chancellor's Medallion features the university seal in bronze brushed with gold, surrounded with decorative florets, each of which holds a sparkling blue stone. The medallion's chain

echoes the decorative pattern that the seal is couched in, complete with stones in the university's spirit color of royal blue. The seal displays symbols of the university's history. The historic Alumni Gates stand near the main entrance of Fayetteville State University (FSU) on Murchison Road. The gates were donated by alumni and erected in 1925. The gateway symbolizes the university's warm and welcoming nature, and the

wrought-iron lamp situated at the center of the arch represents learning and scholarship

as lighting the way to success for our students. Below the gates, the founding year of 1867 is prominently displayed. Between the gates is the Howard School, from which the university emerged. An open book depicts the early mission of the university as a teacher preparatory institution, and the clasped hands over the book symbolize the cooperation among races that has enabled FSU to grow and prosper throughout its 152-year history. Within the banner is the university Motto, "Res Non Verba."


