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

Congresswoman Eleanor Holmes Norton District of Columbia

Keynote Speaker

Congresswoman Eleanor Holmes Norton, a fourth generation Washingtonian, now in her first term in the U.S. House of Representatives, came to Congress as a national figure who has had a distinguished career. She was Chair of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission under President Jimmy

Carter, the only woman to hold that position, Chair of the New York City Commission on Human Rights, and a tenured Professor of Law at Georgetown University. She was also a nationally recognized commentator, writer, civil rights and women's rights leader, and the recipient of 50 honorary degrees. Even before she sought elective office, she had been named one of the 100 most important women in America* and one of the most powerful women in Washington.**

Among the accomplishments of Congresswoman Norton's first term are the Federal Payment Formula Bill, the most important change since Congress granted the District home rule; a \$100 million dollar emergency supplemental appropriation, the first increase in the federal payment in six years; a 40% increase in the federal payment for FY 92; and a leading role in the development of the Civil Rights Act of 1991.

Upon election, Congresswoman Norton selected as her theme, "A Fresh Start with the Congress/A Fair Shake for the District" and sought membership on the three committees and six subcommittees that most closely track her congressional priorities—economic development and political independence for the District. She serves on the Public Works and Transportation Committee and is Vice Chair of its Subcommittee on Public Buildings and Grounds; on the Post-Office and Civil Service Committee; and on the District of Columbia Committee.

Beyond her core committee assignments, Congresswoman Norton is deeply involved in an unusual variety of issues affecting the District and the nation. She is a charter member of the Urban Caucus, and is also a member of the Congressional Black Caucus, the Congressional Caucus on Women's Issues, the Congressional Arts Caucus, the Energy and Environmental Study Conference, and the Federal Government Service Task Force. She also serves on the Executive Committee of the Congressional Tourism Caucus, a priority that reflects the District's second largest source of income.

Congresswoman Norton was elected by her classmates in Congress to the Executive Committee of the Democratic Study Group, the policy and research arm of the Democratic Members of the House of Representatives.

After receiving her B.A. from Antioch College, Congresswoman Norton simultaneously earned a Masters' degree in American studies from Yale Graduate School and a law degree from Yale Law School. In 1980 Yale Law School awarded her the Yale Citation of Merit as the Outstanding Alumnus of the Law School and in 1989, Yale Graduate School awarded her the Wilbur Cross Medal as an Outstanding Alumnus of the Graduate School. She brings to Congress unusually broad experience and professional background. She has served on the boards of three Fortune 500 companies and the Board of the Rockefeller Foundation, as well as the Board of Governors of the D.C. Bar Association and a trustee of many professional, civic and civil rights organizations.



Dr. Lloyd V. Hackley Chancellor, Fayetteville State University

Presiding

Dr. Lloyd V. Hackley was born in Roanoke, Virginia. He has been Vice President in the sixteen campus University of North Carolina System and Chancellor of the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff. Dr. Hackley retired after twenty years in the United States Air Force. He was a distinguished graduate

from Officer Training School. His military decorations include the Bronze Star for Valor, the Meritorious Service Medal and the Vietnam Cross for Gallantry.



From 1968 to 1971, Major Hackley was Intelligence Analyst for the Middle East and Africa and for Soviet foreign policy.

He graduated from Michigan State University in 1965 with a B.A. Degree with high honor in International Relations. At the University of North Carolina, he finished number one in his class at the master's level, and received the Ph.D. in 1976. Dr. Hackley belongs to several academic honor societies including Phi Beta Kappa.

Among his public service activities are: Advisory Member, Board of Directors, Tyson Foods, Inc., Springdale, Arkansas (1990 - Present); Member, Board of Directors, North Carolina Child Advocacy Institute, Raleigh, NC (1990 - Present); Member, Board of Directors, North Carolina Center for Public Policy Research, Inc., (1991 - Present); Member, Principals' Executive Program Faculty, Chapel Hill, NC (1989 - Present); Member, Board of Directors, Occoneechee Council, Boy Scouts of America, Raleigh, NC (1989 - Present); Member, Strategic Planning Team, Cumberland County Board of Education, (1989 - Present); Member, Board of Directors, Southern National Bank, Fayetteville, NC (1989 - Present); Member, Board of Trustees, Fayetteville Area Health Education Center (FAHEC), Fayetteville, NC (1991 - Present); Member, Southern Regional Task Force on the Supply of Minority Teachers; Member, Affordable Housing Task Force for Cumberland County, (1990 - Present); Member, Academic and Poverty Council, North Carolina Poverty Project, (1991 - Present); Representative to the Council of Chief State School Officers' Effective Teaching for At Risk Youth Program; and he is a Mason, a Shriner, and Past Potentate, Fayetteville, North Carolina.

He has also served as Chairman of the Arkansas Advisory Committee to the United States Commission on Civil Rights, 1985; as Chairman of the Subcommittee on Curriculum and Student Matters, Arkansas Quality Higher Education Study Committee; and as Chairman of the Subcommittee on Middle and Junior High Schools, Arkansas Education Standards Committee for Elementary and Secondary Education.

He is married to the former Brenda L. Stewart and they have two children, Dianna and Michael.

THE UNIVERSITY MACE

Originally, the mace was modeled after war clubs carried into battle by 12th century officers. Today, it is used as a symbol of authority. Borne by the chief marshal in all university academic processions, the mace was first adopted at Fayetteville State University in 1986 and redesigned in 1989 to reflect the new seal. It was used for the first time during the 1989 Commencement exercises. The University mace is 40" in length with a cylinder-shaped head cast in hollow brass which bears the university's name, founding year and motto, Res Non Verba, "Deeds Not Words." Adorning the head is the University seal, which was commissioned for the Chancellor's inauguration in April 1989. Embracing the seal are laurels to mark the spirit of victory. Mounted on two sides and at the top of the cylinder are spiral rings that can be seen on the Alumni Memorial Gates. Supporting the polished brass cylinder is a 13" walnut staff tipped with a 3 1/2" solid brass ball. When unattended, the mace stands in a solid walnut base.

THE CHANCELLOR'S MEDALLION

The three-inch Chancellor's Medallion is a gold cast in bronze, replica of the newly designed seal for Fayetteville State University. The Medallion commemorates the Chancellor's Inauguration and bears his name and the date of installation. As part of the official academic dress for the Chancellor of FSU, it is to be worn at all ceremonial occasions. The seal shows at one entrance to the University the historic Alumni Memorial Gates, erected in 1925. Above the gates, the founding year of 1867 is prominently displayed. Between the gates is the Howard School from which the university emerged. An open book depicts the early mission of the University as a teacher preparatory institution and clasped hands inside the book symbolize unity. Within the banner is the University Motto, Res Non Verba, "Deeds, Not Words." The gates are joined at the bottom by laurels to mark the spirit of victory and pine cones to typify the North Carolina landscape. Two lamps of learning adorn the outer edges of the seal and represent the University's mission to impart learning to all who enter.

ACADEMIC ATTIRE

American academic attire had its origins in medieval English universities. It was devised to distinguish academic persons such as doctors, licentiates, masters and bachelors from the lay person, in that everyone wore robes or gowns to ward off the cold. The wearing of the gown, hood and cap was adopted by American colleges and universities from this English custom.

The cap, in academic dress, has the same design for all degrees. Mortarboards are generally recommended, although soft square-topped caps are permissible. The tassel that hangs from the center of the cap usually designates the field of study of the wearer. The black tassel is correct for all degrees; however, the gold tassel is worn by doctors.

The gown, unlike the cap, differs considerably in design according to the degree conferred on the wearer. The gown for the Bachelor's degree has pointed sleeves. It is designed to be worn closed. The gown for the Master's degree has an oblong sleeve. The sleeve base hangs down in the traditional manner. The red part of its oblong shape is square cut and the front point has an arc cutaway. The gown may be worn open or closed. The gown for the Doctor's degree has bell-shaped sleeves. It is faced down the front with black velvet with three bars of the same across the sleeves; or these facings and crossbars may be of velvet of the color distinctive of the subject of which the degree pertains.

The hood for the Bachelor's degree is three feet in length; for the master's degree, three and a half feet in length; and for the Doctor's degree, four feet with panels at the sides. It is lined with the official colors of the university conferring the degree. Also, the discipline of the wearer is indicated by the colors in the hood.


